SUMMER GREETINGS FROM YOUR WINTER ACTIVITY DIRECTOR, SUSAN:

It is time for the summer newsletter with lots of information on our upcoming Winter Activity Season. I am sure many of you are not even thinking that far ahead, three months, when all the Winter Texans start returning! But there is still a lot of planning to finish and preparations to make.

All the permanent full-time residents are only halfway through their summer activities and having a great time with all the events Mike and Anna have planned and held. Judy keeps the 50/50 going and Linda makes sure advertisements are on Facebook all the time as a reminder of what is next.

I will be updating the Activity Calendar with several requests for new activities. Remember, if you want to add an activity, please clear it with me first. I need to be sure there is a time, day and place for your event. You can look at the current calendar and see how full the South Hall is with activities! The North Hall is likewise full of scheduled activities.

There are several activities that are scheduled but do not start until the leader/host arrives back at BOH. Not everyone returns by November 1st. Many do not return until after Christmas/New Years.

If you are in charge of an activity; morning exercise, water aerobics, Wii bowling, line dancing instruction, jam sessions, poker runs, choir practice, potluck suppers to name just a few, please text or email me with your planned arrival date and when you will be ready to start your activity. 603-396-2786 / #208 fulltimers@earthlink.net

There will be the 'usual' activities again this winter season; happy hours, ice cream and birthday cake Tuesdays, jam sessions, entertainment, potluck suppers, soup suppers, Friday dances and some special events on Saturday and Sunday. I will have tours set up for your enjoyment too.

If you have any 'wants', please let me know. I will be happy to set up events that I have not thought about. You, of course, are allowed to have events for the park if you wish. Just be sure to let me know about the time, date and place. I would like to be able to advertise these special events in the Weekly Reminders and Monthly Newsletters.

We have a **Guard House** for checking arrivals at our front gate. There are currently four openings for volunteer workers to staff. The Guard House is open from 9 am to 4 pm Monday through Friday; each worker has an hour and a half shift. Open shifts are Monday, 12:30 pm – 2:15 pm and 2:15 pm – 4 pm; Wednesday 12:30 pm–2:15 pm; Friday 9 am – 10:45 am and 12:30 pm – 2:15 pm. There may be some other shifts opening up if some residents do not return. If there are current workers who do not intend to continue, please let me know as soon as possible so your shift can be covered.

If you are interested, get with me for more details. You can shadow a worker to see how we check in visitors and vendors. We take license plate numbers, names of where vendors are going and make sure they are expected. You will receive a staff T-shirt to wear. Thank you for giving this volunteer job your interest. If there is not sufficient interest to fill all shifts, then the Guard House staffers will be disbanded. There will be no more check-ins of outside visitors.

We are a 'gated' limited access community; but we are NOT a 'secured' community. The streets are not patrolled, and we do not promise security.

Barb from Michigan has sent me some survey questions regarding activities, so I will attempt to answer them:

If the **temperature in the North Hall** needs adjusting for your activity, just give Jeff Thomas a text or call. He can adjust, even if away from the park. His number is 603-842-3627.

There will be no 'small dog' and 'large dog' parks. One **dog park** for all. Please always be watchful of your pet.

I am happy the ladies really enjoyed the **Ladies' Tea**. This event is held every two years; so, the next one will be 2026. It takes many hands and volunteers to bring this event to fruition.

We have entertainment/shows on Wednesdays at 7 pm; first one in Dec for Christmas and then more scheduled in January and February. I am happy the ventriloquist was a hit also! Sometimes entertainment hired does not turn out as we expect; but he was very good!

Michigan is aware the **Bingo machine** needs replacement, but it is way too costly. They are willing to provide a digital machine with TVs. More discussion can be had with details if Bingo leaders want more information.

There are many amenities at Bit-O-Heaven; they are all used at some point. Just because some people do not use all the amenities does not mean we should cancel any.

Years ago, pre-Covid, we had **Senior Olympics**. A series of games in which players can enter and win gold/silver/bronze medals. Some games were individual, and some were teams. There were indoor and outdoor games. After several years, the Olympic Committee retired and we could not get committee replacements; president, secretary, treasurer, activity fee collector, etc. I put out a call last season for residents to step up and restart the Olympics at the request of several residents. No one stepped up. So, there will not be a restart of the Senior Olympic games. You may hold any games you wish. If you are having playoffs and need medals to present to your winners, just let me know and I will be sure to get what you need.

A request was made for the North Hall to be open to more activities during the day. I won't go into too much detail; but if you look at the Activity Calendar for the North Hall, you will see that:

Sunday: may be open from 11 am to 4 pm for activities, if no special events; such as entertainment or Super Bowl, etc.; Church from 8:30 am to 10:30 am. Includes set up time, church, social after church and tear down time. Please, do not come in at this time to get ice. It makes a lot of noise and disrupts the church service; Karaoke – set up at 4:30 pm, event at 5 pm till about 8 pm

Monday: may be open time if no general Wii play scheduled, early morning exercise class, a yoga class has asked to schedule also, Daytime reserved for Wii Bowling in season (usually February when leagues are formed). Informal playing may be scheduled before this; Nickels game played 5 pm-6:45 pm; Movie night is scheduled for 7 pm; when our hosts return to BOH.

Tuesday: two one-hour slots open; after happy hour open at 5:30 pm walk aerobics, choir practice, soft serve ice cream, Happy Hour.

Wednesday: maybe from 8:30 am to 12 noon

Walk aerobics, yoga, jam session, potluck, entertainment

Thursday: no openings till about 8 pm

Walk aerobics, line dancing, set up for soup, soup supper, clean up after soup, nickels game

Friday: 1st Fri – about 11:30 am-5:30 pm

Walk aerobics, yoga, park meeting, evening dance

Saturday: open most days to 1:30 pm, unless special events scheduled Church set up for Sunday 2 pm, sound equipment, bibles, refreshments

When I schedule Saturday afternoon activities, I put the church committee off their set up schedule.

Remember if you have an event, is there prior set up time needed? Tear down time needed after event? So, if your event starts at 1 pm, when do you need to set up, how long after event do you need to tear down and return hall to proper set up? These need to be factored into your total time frame. A one-hour slot may not suit your needs.

All private users of the North Hall need to return chairs to tables properly; three to a side. Tables need to be wiped down if food is served. Tables need to be realigned if moved to accommodate your event. All trash needs to be put in barrels. Use of kitchen requires all dishes to be washed and put away. The kitchen returned to clean and neat condition.

There were a couple of questions in the survey that were not understandable. Wanting more golf days?? Do you mean golf outings? I don't know about any particular golf groups or when they schedule outings. You will need to check the bulletin board for a contact person.

<u>Country vs Rock??</u> Do you want more of one of them? I try to do rock one week and country the next. Does not always work out that way though. Depends on what band I can get on the schedule.

I am working on the 2025-2026 season now. If you have bands, happy hour, show performers, etc. that you would like to perform at BOH, please give me a name and phone number.

By now, most of you know Scott Campbell no longer is the manager of our resort. He is also not working for Bentsen Grove Resort.

Nothing can be done to enlarge the North Hall. We know we are lacking in space for dances and large events. It is all we have to work with. So, some events will require reservations, so we do not sell more seats than we have available.

I have been asked why we allow outsiders to attend our events. Some entertainers or bands have minimum fees. Some bands require a minimum of \$500. This is not a problem with our dance fees. Some bands require \$1200 to \$1300 for their dances. If I have enough attendance, this figure is doable.

One New Year's Eve band required \$2500. I should not have hired them. We did not make enough money at the door to pay the band. I supplemented the fees from the Activity Director funds and 50/50 sales.

I am so pleased with the attendance of BOH residents at our dances and happy hours. You have been generous with your 50/50 ticket purchases, so that pays for a lot of extras.

All major dances are open to the park residents first to purchase their tickets before the event. I don't open sales to the public until the week before the event. We can usually fill all the seats with just park residents now. You have been so faithful to attend most of our dances and it is definitely appreciated. You always have the option to attend your favorite bands at other resorts.

One dance last season, I sold all the seats. I put a 'sold out' sign on the door and I understood some residents did not come in when they saw the sign. I made a big mistake in saying 'sold out'. Why?

Because some people who reserved seats and bought tickets did not come to the dance and did not let me know they were not coming. I could have sold their tickets to those waiting. I felt really bad. Changes had to be made. If you need to cancel the dance, try selling your tickets via Facebook. Please let me know you are not coming so I can sell your tickets; then you will get a refund. Otherwise, No refunds will be given unless there is an illness involved.

So, I will continue to sell to the public to be sure we can fill the seats. Bands have a choice on where they play. We have a much smaller hall than Victoria Palms, Mission Belle, etc. where bands can make more money for 300+ attendees. To draw them to our park, I state we can fill with 240 + a few more. I always take care of the bands and sometimes round up their band take (I like even numbers, IoI) and make it worth their while to come to our resort.

Reserved tables for happy hours and dances have been an issue with some I hear. I have many requests for reserved tables this season from those who had reserved tables last season. I have reviewed all their requests and made a list. Not everyone can have a table in the middle of the room and have the end/floor seats. And I realize that tables up near the stage are not desirable to many; too much noise.

Residents don't realize/remember we have had 'reserved tables' for years! How? Residents would come into the hall before the event and put pieces of paper with their names on them taped to the table where they wanted to sit. Or they used paper plates with their names on them. Same goes for reserved seats at soup supper! Lots of residents have 'their seat/table' where they always sit and want to continue there.

So, you have two choices; revert to paper plates and pieces of paper on tables or pre-pay for dances and get your usual reserved seat/table confirmed. You can **pre-pay for a Friday dance at Happy Hour on Tuesday**. You will get a ticket with a table number; as usual for reserved tables in the past. There will be dances when prepaid reserved seats/tables are not required and you may go in and put your names on the tables where you want to sit, if you wish. Or you can prepay for every dance to guarantee you get your preferred seat. I will post times for Friday night 'dibs' as per events going on at the North Hall earlier in the day. Example; craft fair day, no access to hall until about 2 pm after cleaning and resetting hall.

There are eleven dances where prepayment will be required to determine how many seats are open to the public. These are noted on the dance list with an 'R' next to the price. Moving names from a table that is already 'booked' to another table will not be tolerated.

Those who had reserved tables last season will have their current tables this upcoming season, if requested. There are some changes as there were requests and changes to some tables. I will contact all reserved table holders and advise as to their status. I will also need the names of those at your tables.

Be advised that if you want to change your table number to sit somewhere else, you MUST check with me. The table you want to move to may already be reserved by other people. You will need to ask the 'holder' if they want to change tables with you. Also, not all residents will be returning by Nov 1. So, a table may not look 'reserved' in the early months, but when the resident returns, their reserved table will be returned to them if they still want it.

Happy Hour will be open seating to everyone all season. You can go into the hall to put your names where you want to sit, if you wish, or come in just before the event starts and find a seat. We will give this open seating a try. Be reminded that we have soft serve ice cream at 1 pm on Tuesdays and the tables are full of people eating and socializing until about 2 pm.

I reserve my right to change how seating/table reservations will be handled based on how dances work out for November and December. Not all residents will be back in BOH before the holidays.

I will listen to all parties on this reserved table issue. Please give me options if you have better ideas. I had a few residents say they would never come to a winter dance because of reserved table seating. Imagine my surprise when Jeff and I drove down from MO to attend Mike's summer special dance to see that most of the tables had reserved signs on them!

It has been questioned why the **Activity Director chairs the monthly Park Meeting**. I have been doing this job since Gloria was the manager. Back then, Gloria gave the official park business news, and the office workers would take turns chairing the activity news part of the meeting. Chairing the park meeting became part of my 'job description' when I took over activities; much to the relief of the office workers.

Cindy Preston is the new park manager. She will be giving news of park business. If you have issues with park happenings, you can see her in the office. I will continue to invite outside vendors to bring you information and special tour deals, relate news of upcoming activities and answer questions regarding activities. Remember you get donuts after the meeting for staying till the end!

I am open to complaints, solutions, suggestions, etc. Feel free to tell me just how I should make events better. What events would you like to see added?

I would like to announce that **Nancy Cox and her husband Rick** will be my **activity assistants** and will be helping me out with certain events, happy hours and dances when I cannot be at the park. Nancy has already been taking care of the signups for tours, collecting money and escorting tours. She has done an excellent job with hosting the craft fair at the South Hall. Thanks to both for taking on that job! I have always wanted more crafters, but could only handle one hall, not two! Please give them assistance when asked as they greatly appreciate the help.

This **newsletter** is very 'wordy'. There is an old saying 'You can lead a horse to water, but you cannot make him drink'. Well, this newsletter will be emailed to residents who have emails on file at the office and put in mailboxes for your reading, but I cannot make you read it all! So don't be surprised if you miss something because you did not 'read all about it'.

Thanks to all my helpers all season; Jeff and I could not do this job without all of you! We look forward to working with volunteers again this winter season!

We will be arriving early October this season. We have an OES, Order of the Eastern Star (part of Masonic family organizations), Triennium (every three years) convention, to attend in Myrtle Beach SC mid October. We will return Nov 4th to take over the regular activities.

So, we will not be at BOH for the Halloween potluck and Halloween dance on Oct 31, nor the first dance of the season, Nov 1, with The Rovers. Nancy and Rick will take over for us. Be kind, they are newbies at a lot of things! They will need help and may have questions.


